Worshiping God in Spirit

God lives in a different realm. God is spirit making him invisible to the human eye (Jn. 4:24). Even though we cannot see him, he can see and hear us. He knows our thoughts even before we verbalize them. Here are some suggestions for worshiping the invisible God.

Study what the Bible says about God. The Bible reveals God's characteristics, personality, thoughts, and feelings. It informs us about his desire to be a father and savior. On some occasions, we hear so much about a person that when we meet in person, we already know a lot about them. Bible study enables us to mentally picture God's glory so that our hearts bow to him in adoration, praise, and honor.

Strive to limit distractions. You can minimize physical and mental distractions by sitting toward the front of the room. You are less likely to be disturbed by the movement of others if you sit in front of them. Arrive early and give yourself time to settle in, greet others, make a restroom visit, find a seat, and sit calmly for a minute prior to the beginning of worship service. Don't underestimate the benefits of getting to bed early and rising early.

Envision the throne of God in your mind. God is interested in your thoughts and emotions toward him. I find it helpful to use my imagination and visualize the congregation before the throne of God. Isaiah's vision and John's vision help me to do this (Is. 6:1-5; Rev. 4:1-11). When reading books, we use our imaginations to visualize scenes, characters, and actions. Worship is a time to use our minds to see the glory and wonders of God's throne.
