Discouraged?

Mothers are discouraged when their work and sacrifices are unappreciated. Children are discouraged when parental expectations are out of reach. We are discouraged when we don't have enough money, time, or talent. Discouragement is real for all of us.

Distinguished men of God experienced discouragement. One of them said: *"I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the sons of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars and killed Your prophets with the sword. And I alone am left; and they seek my life, to take it away"* (1 Kings 19:10). God gave Elijah three lessons for overcoming discouragement.

First, trust God to work in His own way. We tend to expect God to work in grand fashion. But the Lord may not choose the great and strong wind, earthquake, or fire (1 Kings 19:11-12). God chooses how He will respond to evil. Most of the time, He responds like a gentle breeze. He says of Himself: *"The LORD, the LORD God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth"* (Exodus 34:6). Let's overcome discouragement by allowing God to work as He wills, not as we desire.

Second, avoid pity parties. We tend to think that we are unappreciated and even opposed by others (1 Kings 19:15-16). Grumbling and complaining keeps us from doing what God calls us to do. Let's get to work growing in Christ, sharing the gospel, and encouraging each other. Then we won't have time for grumbling and complaining.

Third, resist the temptation to feel alone. God tells Elijah that He has 7,000 people in Israel who remain faithful to Him. This is even more amazing when you realize that Israel is immersed in idolatry and is seeking to destroy God's truth (1 Kings 18:4). In the twenty-first century, God's faithful people are overshadowed by wickedness. Nonetheless, there is a faithful remnant.
