Not Guilty

At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"

"No one, sir," she said.

"Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

--John 8:10-11, NIV

What becomes obvious—though I admit to not seeing it for a very long time—is that this woman was penitent. Oh, she was guilty. John does not dispute that. In fact, he states it. She was caught in the very act!

I can see some of us right now, foaming at the mouth because of the betrayal and immorality of someone in the church today who would dare do such a thing!

How could that happen? How could David claim to be a man after God's own heart and do what he did with Bathsheba and Uriah? Oh, wait. David didn't claim to a man after God's heart. God said he was. How can that be? How can we have such sinful people among God's people? Because—praise God—Jesus paid the price for every sin we have committed and will commit.

It is easy to see the warning in Jesus' words to her, especially in my favorite translation, the King James Version, which says, "...go, and sin no more." Jesus' words, however, are not as much a warning as an offer of hope. He is telling her, "You have been forgiven—you now have a reason to leave that life of sin."

That is what we should understand, too. We have hope! We have Jesus! We no longer need to sin. But what happens when we do? What happens when we keep sinning? I'm not talking about sinning because we want to; I'm talking about the man in Romans 7, who can't seem to help himself.

The answer is simple. God, through Jesus keeps on forgiving.

And so should we.
