## Integrity

A preacher presented a sermon on honesty one Sunday. On Monday, he took the bus to get to his office. He paid the fare, and the bus driver gave him back too much change. During the rest of the journey the preacher was rationalizing how God had provided him with some extra money he needed for the week.

But he just couldn't live with himself, so before he got off the bus he said to the driver, "You've made a mistake. You've given me too much change." And he proceeded to give him back the extra money. The driver smiled and said, "There was no mistake. I was at your church yesterday and heard you preach on honesty. So, I decided to see if you practiced what you preached."

In 1959, forty-year-old Ted Williams of the Boston Red Sox was suffering from a pinched nerve in his neck. "It was so bad that I could hardly turn my head enough to look at the pitcher," he said. For the first time in his remarkable career, he batted under .300, hitting just .254 and only ten home runs.

Williams was the highest salaried player in sports that year, making \$125,000. The next year, the Red Sox offered him the same contract. "I told them I wouldn't sign it until they gave the full pay cut allowed—28 percent. My feeling was that I was always treated fairly by the Red Sox. They were offering me a contract I didn't deserve." So, Williams cut his own salary by \$35,000!
