# Safety in the Herd

Watching Wild Kingdom enlightened me to the ways of the world. The predators hunt in a pack seeking to devour a slow, sick, or immature member of the herd. They don't attack the strong and mature in the middle of the herd. In fact, the herd is the safest place for any animal including human beings.

God compares us to sheep and our enemies to wolves (Mt. 7:13; Jn. 10:11, 27). Our greatest predator is a hungry lion (1 Pet. 5:8) and an enraged dragon (Rev. 12:17). Sheep are certainly helpless prey as are human beings against these great killers of souls.

Our best defense is the fold and the Shepherd. However, we are not always in the fold. Occasionally, we must venture out and find pasture. When we do, remaining close to the flock is our best defense. If we wander away from the protection of the flock, we become an easy target for enemies.

It often seems that the weak, the sick, and the young are the ones who separate themselves from the group, even though it is obvious to everyone that these are the ones who need the most protection. It's unfortunate that those who are easiest targets rarely view themselves as such. Sadly, when they do recognize their dangerous position, it may be too late to save them from the jaws of death.

Nature teaches us that there is strength and safety in the assembly. As observant students, we should seek the company of the church family. The enraged dragon is waging war against those who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus (Rev. 12:17). Let's not become a casualty of war because we disregarded a lesson from nature—there is safety in the herd (or the flock).
