If Christians are like shoes, what type of shoe are you?

Loafers. A slothful Christian who arouses the Master's wrath... "cast out the worthless slave into the outer darkness; in that place there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Mt. 25:30).

Overshoes. A Christian only when it "rains," ignoring God until his earthly riches and health fail. This believer is like the thorny soil "... the worry of the world and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful" (Mt. 13:22).

High Heels. This Christian believes himself to be better than others. Paul tells the Christians living in the great city of Rome to "be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation" (Rom. 12:16).

House Shoes. The Christian who stays home and takes it easy. This one might be compared to the guests who made excuses for being unable to attend the master's dinner. In the end, the master rejected them saying, "For I tell you, none of those men who were invited shall taste of my dinner" (Lk. 14:24).

Dress Shoes. This Christian appears religious like the Pharisees who do all their deeds to be noticed by men (Mt. 23:5).

Work Shoes. The Christian who continues in the word of Christ growing in His holy character and zealous for good works (Jn. 8:31; Gal. 5:22, 23; Tit. 2:14).
