"Consider Your Ways"

God made a covenant with Judah. Obedience resulted in His blessings and disobedience resulted in curses (Dt. 28). God brought them back from Babylonian captivity to rebuild the temple in Jerusalem. However, after laying the foundation, enemies verbally discouraged them, and government authority ordered them to stop. Judah soon became engrossed in constructing their own lives. They stopped doing what God called them to do.

God sent the prophet Haggai to remind Judah of their covenant relationship with God. They were experiencing drought and hunger because they were not doing the work God gave them to do. God withheld the rains in accordance with His covenant... "Because of you the sky has withheld its dew and the earth has withheld its produce" (Hag. 1:10). They disobeyed God by neglecting the job He had given them.

God told the people of Judah to think long and hard about the situation... He said: "Consider your ways" (Hag. 1:5,7). In other words, Judah needed to understand their duty. The failure was not on God, the enemies, or the government authorities. The failure was closer to home and much more personal.

This prophecy has me thinking... "Are we obeying God's primary purpose? Are we doing what He has put us here to do?" While we are moral people who worship God, I wonder if we have let enemies discourage us, culture hinder us, and our own busy lives distract us from our God-given duty of proclaiming Jesus to the lost (Mt. 28:18-20; Lk. 19:10; Jn. 3:16; Acts 1:8; 2:36; 3:26; 4:12; 5:42; 8:5, 35; 10:42; 11:20; 17:18).

In recent years, the people of God's kingdom have experienced discouragement, opposition, and distractions. But hear God's word to Judah... "Consider your ways." We might be the problem and the solution. When we preach Jesus, God is with us. What will happen if we repent and keep our part in the new covenant?

It's time for us to think long and hard about why the kingdom of God is not growing. It may be the same reason that hindered Judah in the construction of the temple. The problem may be us. Perhaps, we are listening to our enemies, world authorities, and our own selfish ambitions, but we should be listening to and obeying our God.
