Challenge Your Conclusions

Jesus challenged the established thinking. He defied the belief that an earthly kingdom would be established in Jerusalem (Jn. 18:36). He contested the idea that people of position and wealth were the greatest in the kingdom of God (Mt. 20:26; Lk. 6:20). Jesus disputed the notion that salvation was earned by keeping laws (Jn. 6:29). He condemned making human traditions equal to the authority of God's word (Mt. 15:9).

His challenges to the status quo enraged his enemies (Lk. 19:47), and His "difficult" teachings caused some of his disciples to abandon him (Jn. 6:66).

His apostles continued to test entrenched human thinking. They were arrested and beaten for preaching the resurrection from the dead through faith in Jesus (Acts 5:40). Paul encountered repeated opposition and rejection (Acts 13:8,45,50; 14:2,5,19).

The gospel message continues to contradict human philosophes. It points out erroneous concepts and calls for a change in thinking and behavior (Rom. 12:2). Therefore, as we study the Bible in greater detail and depth, we are likely to find points of contention between what we believe and what the Word of God actually teaches.

When your beliefs are challenged in a group Bible study or by the preaching of God's word, please research your evidence for your conclusions. Be open to the truth of God's word. Don't harden your heart (Acts 7:51). If your beliefs are not being challenged, you may need to study more. You should ask yourself, "Why do I believe what I believe?" and "Are my beliefs in line with God's word?"
