Walkers

A walker makes measurable progress. If we are walking spiritually, we are noticeably progressing in faith, morality, knowledge, self-control, kindness, and such things (Gal. 5:22-23; 2 Pet. 1:5-7).

A walker sees the starting point growing smaller and smaller in the distance. As spiritual walkers, we are increasing the separation between where we began and where we are today. The sins of the past are becoming more sinful and less attractive. Worldly friends are surprised that you no longer indulge the lusts and passions of the flesh (1 Pet. 4:3-4).

A walker focuses on a destination. One can walk to Dairy Queen for an ice cream treat or to the park to play or home to rest. An objective or a reward motivate walkers. We need a valuable purpose at the end of our walk that makes the sweat worth the effort. How does living with God for all eternity sound? The apostle Paul suffered as much as anyone, and he says that the hope of heaven kept him moving forward (Rom. 8:18; 2Cor. 4:16-18).

Walking as children of light implies that we see and avoid temptations (Eph. 5:8). It suggests that we understand the temporary nature of the physical realm and glimpse the glory of eternal life. Most of all, it bears witness to our promise to follow Jesus, the Light of the world (Jn. 8:12).
