Servant

Peter introduces himself as a bond-servant and apostle of Jesus Christ (2Peter 1:1). Bond-servant is a translation of the Greek word *doulos*, which describes a person who voluntarily or involuntarily gives oneself up wholly to another's will. Biblically, a bond-servant is a slave to another's will.

Peter's word order is important. He is first of all a willing slave of Jesus Christ and then His apostle. Peter could not be an apostle without first being a willing slave.

When we introduce ourselves, we may include some title or designation first. We may want people to view us with respect and honor, so we use titles such as Mr, Ms, or Dr.

It occurs to me that unless we see ourselves as slaves of Jesus Christ first, we may not have the proper view of ourselves. And without the proper view of self, we are not going to be the spouse, parent, employee, citizen, and Christian who Christ is calling us to be.

The way we introduce ourselves says a lot about our view point. A change in personal perspective could make a huge difference in the unity and attractiveness of our Lord's church. Let's follow Peter's example and think of ourselves as slaves of Christ above all else.
