Living As Aliens

In the summer of 2013, the Johnson family was preparing to move and teach the Gospel in Indonesia. In preparation for living near the equator in a country made up of hundreds of densely populated islands, they concentrated on six things. Amazingly, these principles can also help us to live as spiritual aliens (1 Peter 2:11).

Be Positive. While some people considered moving away from family to a Muslim country to be "CRAZY," the Johnson family viewed it a fun adventure in which they would gain far more than they were giving up. All Christians need to adopt this positive thinking—what we gain is far more valuable than what we give up (Mt. 10:28-30).

Sell your stuff. The Johnson's sold the stuff that they couldn't take with them. From a spiritual perspective, "stuff" often hinders and even prevents us from moving closer to heaven. Jesus warns us that "...the worry of the world and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful" (Mt. 13:22).

Get in shape. Being in good physical shape helped the Johnson's to overcome the stresses. Likewise, Christians who pray everyday, study the Bible regularly, and fellowship often with fellow Christians are more likely to continue on the path which leads to eternal life (Acts 2:42; Heb. 10:36).

Try new foods. Indonesian cuisine is very different from American foods. The Johnson's had to expand their taste buds. Christians who become content with the status quo. They may refuse to try something new such as teaching a Bible class, facilitating a small group, or attending a fellowship activity. In some cases, they may refuse to sing new worship songs or accept new Bible translation (1Cor. 9:19-23; Phil. 3:13-14).

Turn off the A/C. Air conditioning brings much appreciated relief to those of us living in hot climates. I find that bearing the heat once in a while is a strong reminder of why I do not want to live in "the lake of fire" (Rev. 19:20).

Toss the appliances. The move would mean going without a microwave and a dryer. In preparation, they stopped using these and other appliances. For Christians, sin presents itself as essential, and justifies itself as "a necessary evil." However, people moving toward heaven must toss sin out. In other words, "lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us..." (Heb. 12:1).

This world is not our home. Let's live as aliens NOW so that heaven will be our eternal home.
