The times are tough. People are self-centered and materialistic. Sin is open and rampant. The church seems weak. Nobody wants to get involved.

You want to do what is right but you're not getting much encouragement from others. The people you try to help seem to use you. There are people who are beyond your help and you hurt for them. Then there is the criticism... the endless complaining.

When you feel like you're not making a difference... well, the easiest thing to do would be to quit. I mean that if people don't appreciate what you're trying to accomplish, then just give up trying. After all, the way you see it, everyone else has given up or given in. Just let the unappreciative grumblers have their way. If you back off, then they wouldn't have you to kick around anymore. If you could just quietly sit back... if you could refuse to take any responsibilities or get involved... if you could just take care of yourself, then life wouldn't be so hard on you.

I know a preacher who has been where you are. He's given his life to helping others find their way to heaven, but the very people he has tried to help have turned against him. He has been kicked out of several towns and asked not to come back to a church or two. He has been beaten and rejected. He should have quit... but he didn't. Instead, he just kept encouraging others to join him in the great cause of Christ. He loved to say, *"Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we shall reap if we do not grow weary"* (Gal. 6:9).

How could he do that? What kept him hanging in? His eyes. Look at his eyes. See where they are focused... fixed on Jesus!
