Consequences

Rehoboam was the son of King Solomon who was endowed by God with extraordinary wisdom. When Rehoboam became king of Israel, he faced a choice—to reduce the civil burdens as requested by the people and recommended by his father's counselors or to increase the burden on the people as endorsed by the young men with whom he had grown up (2Chron. 10).

King Rehoboam chose the advice of the young men. He may have wanted to appear strong and authoritative. He could have wanted to break from his father's renown shadow, or he may have been a spoiled, arrogant person.

Whatever his reasons, he did not seem to consider the consequences of his choice. His father's advisors spoke of the consequence of easing the load on the people: *"If you will be kind to this people and please them and speak good words to them, then they will be your servants forever"* (2Chron. 10:7). However, the young men had no thoughts about consequences. When the king did not listen to the people's plea, Israel rebelled against the king (2Chron. 10:16-19).

When we make choices, let's consider the consequences. Don't let selfishness and egotism blind us to destructive consequences. Civil war, congregational splits, and fragmented families are often the results of foolish choices. Let's choose that which results in greater harmony and mutual edification. We have been called to be humble, gentle, and diligent to preserve unity (Eph. 4:1-3).
