Promise Keeper

A promise is only as reliable as the one who makes the promise. For example, federally insured deposits are only valid if the government remains solvent. I could always count on my parents to fulfill a promise even at personal inconvenience and loss. However, in grade school, I learned that not all people are trustworthy. Hence, the pinkie swear was introduced to root out insincerity.

Even when we have every intention of keeping a promise, we may fail because of unforeseen events. Sometimes, we simply do not have the power to keep a promise. For example, we may have promised to play catch with our children after work, but rain forced us to postpone it until the next day.

Fortunately, for us when God makes a promise, He possesses both the foreknowledge and power to fulfill His promise. When we add in the fact that He cannot lie, we absolutely know that we can trust Him to keep His promises (Hebrews 6:18). Israel learned to trust God first hand: *"Not one of the good promises which the LORD had made to the house of Israel failed; all came to pass"* (Joshua 21:45).

We serve a God who has never failed to keep His word. We serve a God who has kept every promise He ever made. He keeps His promises...

"I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you"
(Hebrews 13:5).

"I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:3).

"Be faithful until death, I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10).

We rarely take people at their word because some people lie to gain a personal advantage and others encounter circumstances beyond their control. As a result, we have become skeptical of promise makers. But, God has never failed to keep His word, and He never will.
