Being at peace with each other carries eternal

weight. Jesus affirms that it is better to die a horrible death and be wiped from existence than to cause a fellow-believer to lose his or her salvation (Mk. 9:42). Those who refuse to seek peace are destined to burn in hell "where THEIR WORM DOES NOT DIE, AND THE FIRE IS NOT QUENCHED" (Mk. 9:44).
