Saints

It surprises me to find that the term "Christian" is used only 3 times in the New Testament (Acts 11:26; 26:28; 1Peter 4:16). Followers of Jesus are called "disciples" 269 times, but this term is not used after the book of Acts. The term "saints" appears 60 times from Acts to Revelation.

This leaves me wondering why we have chosen to call ourselves Christians. It's not the choice of the Holy Spirit. When I contemplate the baggage associated with the name "Christian," it amazes me that we continue to use it. I certainly wonder if we are being true to our motto to speak where the Bible speaks if we ignore the other terms given by the Holy Spirit to describe the followers of Jesus.

I encourage us to use the term "saints." It is the translation of a word meaning "holy ones" (*hagios*). It denotes people who have been separated from sin and consecrated for the purposes of God. Saints are like Mom's kitchen knives. She has separated them for kitchen uses. My brothers and I discovered that separated meant for exclusive use. We borrowed a few knives for cutting fishing line, practicing our knife throwing skills, and playing the knife game "stretch." She did not appreciate our inventive uses for her sacred knives.

Referring to ourselves as "saints" could have some positive results. It could change the way we view our relationship with God. We might begin to see ourselves as separated for His purposes and spend more time performing the works of God such as proclaiming the excellencies of God who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light (1Peter 2:9). We may also avoid some places and activities (Ephesians 5:3). Let's be saints—separated from the world and devoted to God.
