Christmas

Christmas is a time for honoring family traditions. Soon after Thanksgiving Day, we decorate the tree according to a selected theme. The last few years it has been "Dr. Seuss." May we all respect one another's beliefs and seek to maintain the unity of the body of Christ. May we pray as the apostle Paul... "that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19a).
