My Church

Jesus told Peter, "...I will build My church" (Mt. 16:18). He did not give any other name. There was no need to give His church a name. He didn't need to distinguish it from any other church.

The following expressions are commonly thought to be authorized names for the church which Jesus built. People put these statements on signs, stationary, T-shirts, and phonebooks: churches of Christ, church of God, body of Christ, church of the living God, and church of the firstborn. While each of these phrases can be found in the New Testament, none of them are intended to serve as a name. They are intended to describe what the church is and to whom it belongs.

Christians use names to distinguish themselves from other Christians with different beliefs and practices. This practice became common during the Protestant Reformation. In the 16th century, men like Martin Luther tried to reform the errant practices of the Catholic church.

Two of the main contributors to naming churches have been straying from the apostles' doctrine and failing to remain united in Christ. If Christians had continued in the apostles' teaching, the church would have remained united in the name of Christ and no other (Acts 2:42; 1 Cor. 1:10; Eph. 4:1-3).

I offer this suggestion. Think of your spiritual journey in terms of being in a relationship with Christ. We tend to think in terms of the location where we meet for worship and the beliefs which we share with others who meet there. In other words, we ought to think of ourselves as abiding in Christ rather than being a member of the group which meets in a church building. This thinking doesn't need a name other than "My church."
